A New Year of Learning Begins!



We are embarking on a new school year of learning and exploring. Our school-wide theme for this year is “God’s Love For Us... Know it, Grow it, Show it!” During the first trimester, we will focus on knowing and learning about God’s love for us. In the second trimester, we will grow God’s love by praying and showing compassion. We will continue in the third trimester to show God’s love through our service to others. We will begin each day with morning prayers including the Act of Consecration to Mary prayer, asking her to guide us as we know, grow, and show God’s love for us. We will also pause as a school community for a mid-day prayer (The Angelus or Easter Season Regina Coeli) and for an end-of-day prayer.

In addition, we will be working together on leadership skills where we will use our personal leadership gifts to lead us on the right path of God’s love. The staff and students will learn about and use “The Leader in Me” program language and ideas. All students have the capacity to lead in their own lives and affect those around them by making positive choices. “The Leader in Me” incorporates 7 Habits that are a synthesis of universal, timeless principles of personal and interpersonal effectiveness such as responsibility, accountability, integrity, adaptability, teamwork, collaboration, cross-cultural skills, problem solving, creativity, and renewal. It teaches 21st century leadership and life skills to students and creates a culture of student empowerment based on the idea that every child can be a leader.
